Specifications

Understanding Texts – Listening (10%)

You will listen to 3 texts in RUSSIAN. You will respond in English to questions phrased in English based on the texts. You may listen to the audio as many times as you need, but you must allow enough time to complete all questions in the assessment within the 20-minute time limit.

Interacting – Speaking (10%)

You are required to have a 2-5-minute conversation with the teacher in RUSSIAN during your scheduled speaking lesson in the assessment week.

Task Description:

Imagine that you are attending an international student conference in Russia, and you have met many Russian-speaking students. One of the students wants to know all about you. Your teacher will play the role of the Russian speaking student.

Your teacher will begin the conversation by introducing himself/herself and giving his/her name. He/she will then ask you some questions.

Types of questions which could be asked:

- What is your name?
- How old are you?
- Where do you live?
- What are the landmarks of your city?
- What is your favourite food?
- How big is your family?
- Do you have any pets?

Instructions for the Listening task:

- Select a **suitable time** during school hours (**8:30-3:30**) from **Monday 3 to Friday 7 June to complete the assessment**. These dates can only be changed in exceptional circumstance and after consultation with the NSW School of Languages Department Head Teacher.
- The task is **timed**; once the assessment task is begun, students will have **20 minutes to complete and submit their answers** before access to the task is closed.
- Students will be allowed **ONE attempt only** to complete the task.
- Students will need to be in a **quiet room, isolated from other students, with internet access to Canvas and a headset**.
- Students are required to complete their responses in Canvas, for instance by selecting the correct response or typing their answers.

- The use of **print dictionaries** is permitted; however, students are **NOT** to access online dictionaries, other electronic devices, or external websites during the assessment.

You will need to show your ability to use the language covered up to Module 10 of the Year 9/Year 10 (100 hour) course.

Feedback provided

You will be assessed on how well you:

- exchange information, ideas and opinions
- use appropriate vocabulary and sentence structures
- use appropriate pronunciation and intonation

The teacher will provide written feedback outlining strengths and areas for improvement to build on knowledge, understanding and skills for future learning.
