Travelling to and from NSW School of Languages	Train, public bus system, private bus system, private car	Accident, breakdown, road congestion, major incident	Home school supervisor to instruct students to adhere to road safety and personal safety procedures; students carry mobile phones to alert NSL, home school and parent/caregiver of situation; student buddy system if coming from same school
	Student becoming lost on way to NSL		Download map of school area from NSL website; NSL teacher to ensure student knows directions to school; student to contact NSL on 9381 4800 if lost.
	Student experiencing allergic reaction or illness on way to NSL		Student to carry appropriate medication for known allergy; student to ring NSL when possible
Local environment risks	Walking around school, in corridors, using stairs		Teacher supervision; orderly conduct by students
	Tripping over bags		Teacher supervision; students' bags and equipment stored away from walkways

Local environment risks cont.	Theft or loss of bags/other equipment		Students requested to leave valuable equipment at home; teacher supervision
	Injury while in class- room or playground		Teacher instruction re expectation of behaviour; teacher supervision
	Fire, smoke, explosion, gas leaks, chemical spills		Response to alarms by following evacuation procedures under the instruction of NSL staff
	Student experiencing allergic reaction or illness while at NSL		Parent/carer to inform NSL of known medical condition on excursion note; NSL to prepare, publish and follow health care plan; NSL to contact parent/carer
	Injuries, cuts, abrasions		Teacher supervision; for minor ailments use first aid kit; for more serious conditions, contact NSL's accredited First Aid officer(s) who will decide on a course of action
Other risks	Industrial strike action		NSL to inform home schools of any cancellation of face to face lessons in advance of the day
	Major incident in area of school	Lock down	Students to follow instructions of NSL chief warden and staff
	Major incident within school	Lock out	Students to follow instructions of NSL chief warden and staff
