TASK DESCRIPTION

Specifications

You are required to have a 3-4-minute conversation with the teacher in GERMAN during your speaking lesson in the assessment week (25-28 March 2024).

You will have TWO weeks to prepare for this task.

As a member of the Student Representative Committee at your German school, you have been given the task of organising a weekend school excursion to a German/Austrian city. To inform students about the arrangements for this excursion, you will need to create a brochure in which you explain the major aspects of the excursion. In this brochure you need to include information about:

- your point of departure
- your transport to and from the chosen destination
- your destination
- your overnight accommodation
- 3 activities at the chosen city

Your brochure is required to be emailed to your teacher THREE working days before the Assessment date. During your Assessment you will need to tell your teacher what you have included in your brochure. You may refer to the brochure during your Assessment. Your teacher will then ask you questions about:

- the time of your departure
- the cost of the excursion including the cost of meals, transport, food, overnight stay and activities in Euros
- items you need to bring with you
- when you will return

Your brochure and your answers to your teacher's questions need to be based on authentic research. You will need to show your ability to use the language covered up to Module 6 of the Year 10 course and include language covered in the Year 9 course.

Feedback provided

You will be assessed on how well you:

- exchange information, ideas and opinions
- use appropriate vocabulary and sentence structures
- use appropriate pronunciation and intonation

The teacher will provide written feedback outlining strengths and areas for improvement to build on knowledge, understanding and skills for future learning.
