## TASK DESCRIPTION

### **Specifications**

You are required to have a 3-4-minute conversation with the teacher in MODERN GREEK during your speaking lesson in the assessment week (25-28 March 2024). At the start of the assessment, you will be shown three stimulus images and accompanying questions. You will have 1 minute of preparation time to think about the questions provided. You will then engage in a 3-4-minute conversation with the examiner in which they will also ask you some follow up questions. You may not make notes during the task.

You will need to show your ability to use the language covered up to Module 5 of the Year 10 course and include language covered in the Year 9 course.

### **Feedback provided**

You will be assessed on how well you:

- exchange information, ideas and opinions
- use appropriate vocabulary and sentence structures
- use appropriate pronunciation and intonation

The teacher will provide written feedback outlining strengths and areas for improvement to build on knowledge, understanding and skills for future learning.
