Section I: Listening – 20%

To access the **supervised** task, click on the Assessment block in your Canvas course. This is a timed task, and you will have 25 minutes and only **ONE attempt** to complete the task. Do not attempt the task unless you are supervised and have the required time to complete it. If you experience any difficulties, contact your NSW School of Languages teacher immediately.

You should not have access to any course materials or any other browser tabs, computer programs, or other electronic devices. A failure to comply will result in a mark over zero being recorded. You may have a spare blank piece of paper with you to take notes during the listening. This paper will not be collected or marked.

You will hear **FIVE** texts based on the topics above. Each text will be played twice. You will be required to respond to the questions in English.

Section II: Speaking – 10%

During your scheduled speaking lesson in the assessment week, you will be shown some stimulus pictures related to the relevant syllabus topics. You will have two minutes to study the pictures and select any **TWO** of them. Each image is accompanied by a scenario in English. You may **NOT** make any notes.

You will be required to engage in a 5-minute conversation with your teacher in Greek, in which you will address your chosen images and scenarios. Your teacher will then ask you follow-up questions about each image in Greek. The conversation will be recorded.

Feedback provided

The teacher will provide written feedback outlining strengths and areas for improvement to build on knowledge, understanding and skills for future learning.
