**Section I: Listening – 20%**

To access the **supervised** task, click on the Assessment block in your Canvas course. This is a timed task, and you will have 30 minutes and only **ONE attempt** to complete the task. Do not attempt the task unless you are supervised and have the required time to complete it. If you experience any difficulties, contact your NSW School of Languages teacher immediately. You should not have access to any course materials or any other browser tabs, computer programs, or other electronic devices. A failure to comply will result in a mark over zero being recorded. You may have a spare blank piece of paper with you to take notes during the listening. This paper will not be collected or marked.

You will hear FOUR texts based on the topics above. Each text will be played twice. You will be required to respond to the questions.

In Part A, you will respond in English to questions phrased in English by typing your responses directly into Canvas.

In Part B, you will respond in Russian to questions phrased in English and in Russian by writing your responses by hand on the assessment paper provided.

**Section II: Speaking – 10%**

You will participate in a 3-5-minute conversation with your teacher during your scheduled speaking lesson in the assessment week. The conversation will be based on one of the syllabus concepts. The task will be recorded. The task focuses on the topic of education and aspirations - my school. You will have two weeks to prepare for this task. You will be asked questions about the following:

- Location of your school
- The type of school you attend
- How you get to school
- Your subjects and assignments
- The school buildings
- What your school library is like

The teacher will provide written feedback outlining strengths and areas for improvement to build on knowledge, understanding and skills for future learning.
