Preliminary Course Examination – Assessment 3

This examination is the **final** assessment for this course.

Date of Assessment: Tuesday, 8 September, 2020

Venue:

- The date of the assessment can only be **changed in exceptional circumstances and after consultation with the Department Head Teacher**. Students who cannot sit for the assessment on the above date for health reasons must send a medical certificate and complete an [Exam Change of Date or Venue](#) form. - All students will do the Written assessment at their **home school on the above date**. This date can only be **changed in exceptional circumstances and after consultation with the Department Head Teacher**. A time will be organised for the Speaking test to be conducted by phone. Students who cannot sit for the assessment on the above date for health reasons must send a medical certificate and complete an [Exam Change of Date or Venue](#) form.

Time frame

- **Speaking** – approximately 5 minutes
- **Written paper** – 1 hour and 35 minutes (including 5 minutes reading time).

The paper will consist of three sections:

- Section I** – **Listening** (approximately 20 minutes)
Section II – **Reading** (approximately 40 minutes)
Section III – **Writing** (approximately 30 minutes)

Scope and Format of Assessment 3

Marks and Weightings

The Assessment will contribute **40%** to the Preliminary Course Assessment mark and is distributed between Course components as follows:

Description of Assessments 3

Speaking (Outcomes: 1.1, 1.2, 1.3, 1.4, 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4)

- This assessment is designed to assess the student's knowledge and skills in using spoken Modern Greek.
- Students are **NOT** permitted to take notes or dictionaries into the Speaking assessment.

Specifications

- There will be a conversation in **Modern Greek** between the student and an examiner of approximately **5 minutes** duration.
- Topics of the conversation will be based on the main theme of *The Personal World* and may include:
 - the personal world

Written Assessment

- Use of monolingual and/or bilingual print dictionaries **IS** permitted during this examination. However, they must not be annotated.
- **No mobile phones or any electronic devices are allowed.**
- Questions will be based on any of the themes and topics covered in the Preliminary Course.

Section I – Listening (Outcomes: 2.1, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4, 2.5, 2.6)

This examination is designed to assess the student's knowledge and skills in understanding and analysing information from spoken texts that are in Modern Greek.

Specifications

- Students will hear five items in Modern Greek. Each text will be read two times. There will be a brief pause between the first and second readings during which students may take notes. They will be given sufficient time after the second reading to complete responses.
- Students will be expected to respond to a range of question types including multiple choice, complete the table and short answer questions that will require a response in **ENGLISH**.

Section II – Reading (Outcomes: 2.1, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4, 2.5, 2.6)

This examination is designed to assess the student's knowledge and skills in understanding and responding to written texts that are in Modern Greek.

Specifications

There will be three texts to test comprehension of written Modern Greek. Questions will be in English and will require answers in **ENGLISH**.

Section III – Writing (Outcomes: 1.1, 1.2, 1.3, 1.4, 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4)

This section of the examination is designed to assess the student's ability to express ideas through the production of original texts in Modern Greek.

Specifications

Students will be expected to write **ONE task**. The total expected length of the response will be approximately **100 words in Modern Greek** using the required text type of a diary entry.

Criteria for Judging Performance

Speaking

In your answers you will be assessed on how well you:

- engage in a conversation;
- select and incorporate particular vocabulary and structures to achieve specific communication goals;
- structure information and ideas coherently;
- demonstrate clarity of expression (pronunciation, intonation, stress).

Listening

In your answers you will be assessed on:

- how well you identify, summarise and interpret general and/or specific aspects of texts;
- how accurately you convey the relevant information in English;
- how well you identify and explain aspects of the culture of the Greek-speaking communities.

Reading

In your answers you will be assessed on:

- how well you identify, summarise and interpret general and or specific aspects of texts;
- how accurately you convey the relevant information in English;
- how well you convey an intercultural understanding of Greek-speaking communities.

Writing

In your answers you will be assessed on how well you:

- communicate relevant ideas and information;
- write text appropriate to audience, purpose and context;
- structure and sequence ideas and information;
- demonstrate control of vocabulary and language structures in Modern Greek.

Procedures for Assessment 3

Examination held at the home school

- Supervisors are requested to contact the Head Teacher on (02) 9381 4910 if the audio file and the Examination paper are not received by **the week before the date of the examination** or if they are faulty.

- **The Supervisor will be emailed the audio link in advance for the Listening section.**

- Supervisors are requested to delete the audio file as soon as the Listening section is completed.
- Students **must be supervised** throughout the assessment.
- The date and time for the phone Speaking assessment will be confirmed for each student one week prior to the examination.
- Examinations should be held in a quiet room.
