TASK DESCRIPTION

Prescribed Text: Cicero, *In Catilinam I*

Section I – Skills in Translating – (20 marks) – 10%

There will be **TWO** short extracts from the prescribed text. You will be required to translate the extracts into English.

Section II – Skills in Grammar Analysis, Understanding Prescribed Text (20 marks) – 10%

Skills in Grammar Analysis – there will be **TEN** short-answer questions requiring you to analyse grammatical features of an extract from the prescribed text.

Understanding Prescribed Text – there will be **THREE** questions requiring you to demonstrate your understanding of extracts from the prescribed text.
