Specifications:

Listening (20 marks) - 20%

You will hear **SIX** texts in CHINESE based on the above topics. You will be required to respond in **English** to questions phrased in English. You will complete this assessment under supervision in your home school on the answer paper provided.

Speaking (10 marks) – 10%

You will be required to give a 1-minute oral presentation and engage in a 4-minute conversation about the relevant topics. You will complete this assessment under supervision in your home school via TEAMS. The Speaking section will consist of two parts.

Part A

You will be given 5 minutes to prepare an oral presentation in Chinese. You are permitted to take a blank piece of paper with you into the assessment to make notes during the preparation time only. You will speak for approximately **1 minute in Chinese**.

Part B

The examiner will ask you further questions on the chosen topic as well as any other questions relevant to your personal world. The interview will take **4 minutes** and will be **in Chinese**.

Feedback provided

The teacher will provide written feedback outlining strengths and areas for improvement to build on knowledge, understanding and skills for future learning.
