Specifications:

Listening (15 marks) – 15%

You will hear **TWO** texts in JAPANESE based on the above topics. The texts will be accompanied by questions in English and in Japanese. You will be required to answer the questions in English or in Japanese as specified. You will complete this assessment under supervision in your home school on the answer paper provided.

Speaking (20 marks) – 10%

You are required to choose a topic that relates to one of the five issues studied in the JAPANESE in Context course in which you have a strong interest.

You will present your findings of your chosen research topic for 1 minute, then engage in a Q & A discussion with the examiner for 6 minutes, talking about your research and findings in depth.

An interview sheet will be published in Moodle two weeks prior to the task. You are required to hand in the interview sheet via email on Monday 4th March.

You will complete this assessment online under supervision in your home school.
