Written Assessment: paper-based task

Section I - Response to Prescribed Text (20 marks) - 10%

Part A - this part is designed to assess your ability to respond critically to the prescribed text. You will read **one extract** from the prescribed text and respond to questions phrased in English requiring a response in English. You will be required to:

- analyse and evaluate aspects of the text
- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of language features, content and the social, political, cultural and/or literary context of the text
- analyse how meaning is conveyed, and explore the relationship between the prescribed text and the prescribed issues

Part B - You will read an excerpt from one extract of the prescribed text. There will be a question phrased in English and in Japanese requiring a response of approximately 400 ji in Japanese. You will be required to respond to an aspect of the prescribed text by taking the role of a character, imagining a hypothetical situation, or writing a description of an event from a different perspective. The response will be in the form of a letter, diary entry, narrative account, or the script of a conversation, speech, monologue or interview.

Section II - Writing in Japanese (15 marks) - 10%

There will be TWO extended response questions phrased in English and in Japanese requiring a response of approximately 600 ji in Japanese. You will be required to answer ONE question. The questions will relate to the prescribed issues, and will specify the audience, purpose, context and text type of the response. You will be required to write a short essay, an article, the script of a talk, a formal letter or a report in which you will evaluate and justify a point of view.

Speaking (10 marks) - 10%

Your response will take the form of a monologue, in which you will present and support a point of view. You will be given 7 minutes preparation time in which you may make brief notes on the assessment paper. You may refer to your notes during the assessment, but you must NOT read directly from them.

You will be required to:

- select and respond to ONE question from a choice of TWO. The questions will be phrased in English and in Japanese. Both questions will relate to the prescribed issues.
- speak for approximately THREE minutes in Japanese.

Your assessment will take place online during the week 5-9 August on a date and time scheduled with your home school supervisor. The speaking assessment will be recorded. You will be required to submit any notes you make during the preparation time.

Feedback provided

The teacher will provide written feedback outlining strengths and areas for improvement to build on knowledge, understanding and skills for future learning.
