PAPER 1 - Module A: Texts and Human Experiences Section I - Part A Reading (15 Marks) You will be required to read 3-5 unseen texts based on Module A. There will be several short answer questions based on the texts.

Section I - Part B Extended Response (15 Marks)

You will be required to write ONE extended response based on Module A.

Section II: Focus on Writing (15 marks)

You will be required to write ONE extended response, either creative, persuasive, discursive or informative.

PAPER 2 - Modules B and C

Section I - Module B: Language, Identity and Culture (20 marks)

You will be required to write ONE extended response based on Module B

Section II - Module C: Close Study of a Text (20 marks)

You will be required to write ONE extended response based on Module C

Listening – 15 marks

This task is designed to assess students' ability to listen with understanding and give written responses to a range of verbal cues.

- You will be given **two minutes** to read the questions. Then you will hear a recording of approximately 7 minutes and a reading of the questions. You will hear the recording a second time, and then you will be given **10-12 minutes** to write your answers.
- There will be a number of short answer questions based on the listening text.
