Assessment 4 - Written Paper

Section I: Listening (30 marks) – 10%

You will hear NINE texts in Japanese based on the topics above. You will be required to respond in English to questions phrased in English.

Section II: Reading (30 marks) – 10%

You will read FOUR texts in Japanese based on the topics above. You will be required to respond in English to questions phrased in English.

Section III: Writing in Japanese (20 marks) – 10%

You will be required to respond to **THREE** questions by writing in Japanese. Two questions require a short response (approximately 100 ji and 150 ji respectively) and one question requires a longer response (approximately 250 ji). The questions will indicate the purpose, context and audience for your responses.
