## **Caltex Best All-Round Award**

Congratulations to our student Alisar Kanjrawi, who has received the Caltex Best All-Round Award. Alisar studied French at Open High School. Here is her journey – from Syria to success.

Caltex Best All-Rounder recipient Alisar Kanjrawi admits that, at one stage during her final year of high school in Sydney, she did not have much self-confidence, despite the support of many of her peers.

It was only after she had been declared Dux of her school, with outstanding grades, did she really start to believe in her own abilities.

It's understandable, of course, that Alisar faced some such challenges. She arrived in Australia from Syria with her younger brother in early 2013. Her parents, both medical professionals, had sent the children from their small coastal city, Latakia, to Australia to escape the civil war in their home country.

"I was inspired by my parents who both have postgraduate degrees – Mum is a gynaecologist and Dad is a dentist – to look for better education in a safer environment," Alisar explains.

In Syria she attended a selective school, a "competitive yet supportive environment" where she participated in volunteering and worked with The Syria Trust for Development on projects serving the community. She continued her community work when she came to Australia, volunteering, for example, for the Dymocks charity during Christmas 2013. "I get the best feeling when I communicate with and help other people out," she says.



## Love of languages

In Australia Alisar was also a Year 12 leader and secretary of the SRC. Her love of languages inspired her to study French through distance education at Open High School because "just like volunteering, learning languages means making connections with others," she says. "It's not just about words; language reflects cultures and gives an insight into traditions and habits."

She is now studying a B.Science/M.Nutrition and Dietetics at the University of Sydney because it combines her passion for helping people and a love of science. "My dream is to become a dietitian at a well-recognised hospital in Sydney or to open my own practice."

Astra Vilkins, Head Teacher at Open High School who nominated Alisar for the all-rounder award, praises her serious attitude to study, maturity and ability to adjust to her new social and school

environment. "Alisar is very proactive in the management of her studies," says Ms Vilkins. "She achieved equal first place in Preliminary French Beginners, scoring 98% and third place in HSC French Beginners, scoring 94%.

## 'A true global citizen'

"She is also friendly, confident and reliable . . . [with] excellent interpersonal skills and is always respectful and courteous. She demonstrates a well-rounded awareness of the world and its cultures, which I believe is achieved through her natural curiosity and thirst for knowledge. She is an exemplary role model and has the makings of a true global citizen."

Alisar's advice for others is to believe in yourself and be determined. "What motivates me is the rewards I get for my hard work, such as the amazing Caltex Award I got in September. It's a great way to appreciate students who put in extra effort and give up their time."

During her HSC, Alisar had this quote hanging on her wall: "It's not easy but it's worth it".

"Nothing ever sounded more motivational to me than this!" she says.
